Subject:	RENAMING OF FULLERTON STREET - OUTCOME OF COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

Purpose of the Report:	To report on the outcome of community consultation in relation to the proposed renaming of Fullerton Street as Ukraine Street.
Alignment to Delivery Program:	Strategy 11.1: Facilitate community led decision-making that is open, honest and ethical and benefits the broad community.

Recommendation:

THAT Council, having regard to the strong opposition from residents of Fullerton Street Woollahra (and surrounding streets) to rename Fullerton Street to Ukraine Street, take no further action on the renaming of Fullerton Street.

Executive Summary:

This report provides information on the community consultation process undertaken by Council staff in relation to a proposal to rename Fullerton Street, Woollahra as Ukraine Street, in accordance with a Council resolution from the 9 May 2022 Council meeting.

The reports presents an overview of the level of engagement Council has had on this matter and details the strong opposition to the renaming proposal from those people most directly affected, noting that there is some level of support for the renaming of Fullerton Street by people less directly affected by it.

In light of the high level of opposition from the immediate local community, Council staff are recommending that no further action be taken on the renaming proposal.

If however, Council wishes to proceed with the renaming proposal, this report outlines in broad terms the process to be followed for the renaming of Fullerton Street Woollahra.

Discussion:

At the Council meeting held on Monday 9 May 2022 and in response to a Notice of Motion on this matter, the following was resolved by Council:

THAT Council undertake the necessary processes to:

- A. As a matter of urgency Council commences community consultation with residents of Fullerton Street, Woollahra and prepare a further report advising on progress and feedback regarding renaming of Fullerton Street to Ukraine Street*
- B. Simultaneously with part A, Council initiates the application with the Geographical Names Board to change the name of Fullerton Street to Ukraine Street*
- C. Mayor writes to all candidates contesting for the seat of Wentworth (in the Federal Election) to request that the number of humanitarian visas be increased.*

This report deals with points A. and B. from the above-mentioned resolution of Council. Following the Council meeting held on 9 May 2022, an email was sent to all Councillors on Friday 13 May 2022 by the Director Infrastructure and Sustainability, providing an update on the community consultation process, which was underway by then.

The email also advised that the process for street renaming, as outlined in the *NSW Address Policy and User Manual* (the Manual), would require the Council to further consider the renaming proposal following completion of the consultation process and prior to submitting the proposal to the Geographical Names Board (GNB) Secretariat.

The importance of the above-mentioned email was that the process to be followed as per the Manual was not as per the process detailed in part B of the above-mentioned Council resolution. Councillors were therefore advised of the Council staff intention to provide a further report to Council after completion of the consultation process.

Council must now consider the feedback received and determine whether to 'ratify the proposal and either endorse it for submission to the GNB Secretariat, or discard/amend it' (the Manual p130).

Community Engagement

Community consultation commenced on Friday 13 May 2022 and ended on Friday 3 June 2022, a period of 15 working days, which is the minimum period recommended in the Manual.

Notification to the community consisted of the following;

- Letters to residents and non-resident property owners and businesses in Fullerton Street and immediately surrounding streets. (Attachment 1)
- Corflute signage in Fullerton Street and surrounding streets. (Attachment 2)
- Poster in foyer of Piccadilly Gardens apartment complex
- 'Have Your Say Page on Council website
- Notification in the Wentworth Courier

Letters were hand-delivered by address to all properties in Fullerton Street. All residences in Fullerton Street where the rates mailing address was NOT the property address also received the letter by mail to the nominated mailing address, which generally captures property owners in addition to the tenant. Additionally, properties in Trelawney Street, Wellington Street and Rosemont Avenue (to the bend at No.12 / No.5) received a hand-delivered letter to the property. A total of 126 letters were sent by mail, and approximately 450 letters were delivered by hand.

Respondents were invited to complete a survey / questionnaire on the Have Your Say Council web page or to correspond directly with Council.

At the closing date of 3 June 2022, approximately 840 submissions were received. These responses are summarised in the following table.

As detailed in the above summary table, there is a clear pattern of opposition to the proposal to rename Fullerton Street Woollahra to Ukraine Street, from those most directly affected by the renaming i.e. those who reside, own property or operate a business or service in Fullerton Street.

It is worth noting the very high level of response from residents and businesses in Fullerton Street in particular. There are approximately 128 dwellings in Fullerton Street and 122 responses were received from the street. Even with allowance for some duplication between tenants and non-resident owners, this is an exceptionally high response rate to this matter.

This pattern of opposition continues (albeit less strongly) throughout adjacent streets and suburbs. Support for the proposal is only demonstrated by respondents who either reside outside of the affected area or who did not provide a location as part of their submission.

For those opposed to the proposal, the reasoning provided is quite diverse but the following themes were discernible in the written responses:

- Inconvenience of changing address (especially for the elderly)
- Empty gesture with no impact (noting widespread support for Ukraine and condemnation of Russia's actions)
- Unfair to local Russian community

- Council should focus on issues in its direct control
- Waste of money and resources
- Potential precedent, noting numbers of consulates in the local area
- Long history as Fullerton Street

For those who support the proposal, the reasoning was reasonably consistent and clear, which was to express support for the Ukrainian people and condemnation of Russia's actions.

It should be noted that this matter received widespread media coverage, which is likely to have played a role in influencing the number of submissions received. In addition to the significant amount of submissions lodged via our online community engagement platform and the amount of emails received by Council, our Customer Experience staff and other relevant staff received a large volume of telephone calls on this issue. Customer Experience staff generally logged phone calls directly onto the Your Say platform while the caller was on the phone to register their submission.

Attached is the report from the Your Say submissions received between 13 May to 3 June 2022. Please note that personal details and inappropriate language have been redacted from the attached document. Further to this, the document lists the comments in two groups, with the first group being the comments opposing the renaming proposal, with the second group being the comments supporting the renaming proposal.

It must be noted that the attached document only lists documents that were lodged via the Your Say online process and this is also reflected in the graphical information included in the attachment. This data does not incorporate duplicated email submissions where there were 91 duplicated email submissions to those that were also lodged via the Your Say submission process.

As noted, the email submissions are captured in the numerical table included above. Further, the written commentary in the emails follow similar themes to those outlined above.

Options:

Having considered the feedback from the community consultation, Council may resolve to either take no further action on the proposed renaming or may resolve to continue with the proposal.

If Council resolves to continue with the renaming proposal, the following process will ensue, noting that the process outlined here is in broad terms only and is taken from a:

- Review of the processes recommended in outlined in the NSW Address Policy and User Manual.
- Review of the NSW Roads Act 1993.
- Review of NSW Roads Regulation 2018.
- Discussions with staff of the Geographical Names Board (GNB) Secretariat.

Road renaming process

1. Renaming proposal submitted to the Geographical Names Board
2. GNB Secretariat will notify 'relevant parties' who will be given 15 days to respond. Relevant parties will be;
 - (a) Australia Post,
 - (b) The Registrar-General,
 - (c) The Surveyor-General,
 - (d) The chief executive of the Ambulance Service of NSW,
 - (e) Fire and Rescue NSW,

- (f) The NSW Rural Fire Service,
 - (g) The NSW Police Force,
 - (h) The NSW State Emergency Service,
 - (i) The NSW Volunteer Rescue Association,
3. If no objections are received from relevant parties, the GNB Secretariat may approve or reject the proposal on behalf of the Surveyor General. (Note that under the Road Regulations 2018, Council may not proceed with the proposal against an objection by a relevant party except with the approval of the Minister).
 4. If the proposal is approved by the GNB Secretariat, proposal will proceed to final notification of the local community and gazettal.
 5. If the proposal is rejected by the GNB Secretariat and Council feels there are grounds for appeal, Council may ask for an appeal to be referred to the Surveyor General.
 6. The Surveyor General may either approve or reject the proposal.
 7. If the rejection is upheld, Council may appeal the decision of the Surveyor General to the Roads Minister.

Policy Implications:

There are no direct policy implications as a result of this report.

Financial and Resourcing Implications:

The direct financial implications of an approved road renaming are not significant and will be limited to the direct costs of new street blade signs and any necessary advertising and notification costs.

Having said the above, there will however be significant resourcing implications in terms of staff time devoted to preparation of the application to the GNB Secretariat, management of any appeals processes and further community notification that may be required as part of this process. At this stage, it is not possible to quantify the staffing resource that will be required.

Conclusion:

In response to the Council resolution of 9 May 2022, Council staff have undertaken detailed community consultation on the proposal to rename Fullerton Street Woollahra as Ukraine Street.

As detailed in this report, there is a high level of opposition to the proposal among those people most directly affected by the renaming proposal, with some support demonstrated by respondents who are either not residents in the immediately affected area or who did not provide an address with their submissions.

In light of the high level of opposition to the proposal, Council staff are recommending that no further action be taken on the proposed renaming.

**A request for your feedback on the proposed
renaming of Fullerton Street to Ukraine Street
and an outline of the processes involved.**

On the 9th of May 2022, Woollahra Council resolved to initiate the process for Fullerton Street to be renamed as Ukraine Street.

The resolution followed the unanimous acknowledgment by Council in February 2022 of the impact of the ongoing conflict between Russia and the Ukraine and condemnation by Council of the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

In addition to the street renaming proposal we are informing you about today, the Council is also calling on the Federal Government to increase humanitarian immigration support for Ukrainians escaping conflict.

The proposed renaming of Fullerton Street follows similar initiatives in other countries including the United Kingdom, Scotland, Denmark, Canada, Norway, Lithuania, Czechoslovakia, Latvia and Albania, where streets with Russian Embassies are being renamed in support of Ukraine and its people.

The process for the proposed street renaming is summarised here:

- Woollahra Council as the Roads Authority has the power to change the road name, in consultation with the Geographical Names Board (GNB).
- There is a general procedure GNB use (*link available on Your Say*). GNB requires Council to consult with the community and notify for a period of 15 working days.

We seek your feedback on the proposed name change by 3 June 2022 via our online community engagement platform yoursay.woollahra.nsw.gov.au/fullerton. Alternatively, written correspondence can be sent to Council via the postal address (below).

Feedback is open to residents, owners and businesses on Fullerton Street and to the general community. We are also required to notify a number of agencies (eg Police, Fire, Ambulance, Australia Post etc).

It is important to note that if the GNB supports a change in street name, it is permanent. Residents would be responsible for managing their change of address and contact details as required.





Far from it, it was prompted by a petition of mostly non-residents with no regard of the potential consequences for the area and its residents. - Even allowing such a political stand on behalf of all residents of Woollahra, the council erroneously states there has been overseas precedence. This is inaccurate as the cited examples relate to streets where Russian embassies, not an outpost in the form of a consulate, are located. I urge the Council to forward the petition to the relevant council in Canberra. - Disregarding that this is unilateral political activism, let us apply first principles and look at what action would have the most meaningful impact for the people of Ukraine. The proposed name change is hardly the one measure that would provide the most support to the Ukrainian people, more specifically, I do not believe that the people of Ukraine would neither notice nor care about the change in street name. What the people of Ukraine would care about are funds to rebuild their schools and hospitals, to send medication and supplies. With that in mind, I urge the council to channel their well meaning intentions into actions that have a real impact, for example, to organise a fundraiser or a Fullerton Street neighbourhood festival to fundraise and support the people of Ukraine. Opposing the name change does not mean that residents are supportive of the Russian invasion of Ukraine. Just the opposite. As well as the inconvenience involved, we are concerned that the Council is virtue signalling at the expense of 150 years of Woollahra history. Fullerton Street is one of a number of streets in West Woollahra to be named after British Commanders who served in the Napoleonic wars. The others include Trelawney Street, Wellington Street, Forth Street and Nelson Street. There is evidence that these streets were named sometime before 1868 and possibly before the Woollahra Council came into being. My understanding of the Woollahra Council's mandate is that it is to regulate and manage services and activities, such as, roads and footpaths, waste

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management, parking, recreational facilities, water and sewage, town planning and development, building approvals and inspections, and domestic animal regulation, to benefit Council district residents. I can find no information that points to a Council having the right to intrude into international politics, to the point where it decides to change street names for international political reasons. International political activism is not in the Council's mandate. At the Council Meeting on 9 May a motion was passed to initiate renaming Fullerton Street to Ukraine Street. Fullerton Street is in Cooper Ward. The motion was brought to the Council by Ms Elsing, a Council Member for Cooper Ward. The Minutes record that the proposed motion has the support of the Embassy of Ukraine in Australia, the Australian Federation of Ukrainian Organisations (AFUO) and the Ukrainian Council of NSW (UCNSW), umbrella bodies respectively for national and NSW-based Ukrainian community organisations. They represent Ukrainian churches, youth and women's organisations, the credit co-operative movement, educational, returned service, language and other organisations. It appears no preliminary thought was given to canvas views of the residents of Fullerton Street before considering the motion to change a street name that has been part of Woollahra history for more than 150 years. The minutes are silent as to whether any advice was sought from Federal Government Departments, including the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, about the proposed name change. Australia has implemented sanctions against Russia, as well as providing significant military and humanitarian aid to Ukraine. and is committed to continue doing so. Australia is also fast-tracking visas for Ukrainians who have fled from the fighting. Australians overwhelmingly support the ongoing aid despite the very high cost to the taxpayer as the aid provided is practical and assists the people of Ukraine. Changing a street name pales into insignificance against what Australia is doing to assist Ukraine. Changing the name of a street does nothing for the Ukrainian people, and it does not impact on Putin. It does, however, cause considerable inconvenience to your ratepayers in Fullerton Street. Something that will no doubt be remembered when we again get to vote as to who should represent Cooper Ward in the future. It is ironic that the person who raised this motion without consulting us is from Residents First. The Minutes also reveal that the Ukrainian Ambassador, based in Canberra, lobbied the Council to change the street name to Ukraine Street. One presumes that the Ambassador had also lobbied the ACT Government to rename Canberra Avenue in Griffith to Ukraine Street, as that is the address of the Russian Embassy. As no such name change has been made in Canberra, it can be safely assumed that his efforts were unsuccessful. As a former Australian diplomat, with several postings, including one to the then Soviet Union, I know that the role of an Embassy is to represent one's country, to handle major diplomatic issues and trade issues to ensure that one's citizens abroad are protected. The Ambassador is

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the chief diplomat and spokesperson for his country abroad. Consulates, on the other hand, handle minor diplomatic issues such as issuing visas, promoting trade issues, and assisting their citizens travelling abroad if they get into difficulties. Written material letterboxed to residents by a Ukrainian Organisation of unknown provenance claimed that "The Russian Consulate...continues to spread lies about the war in Ukraine" as a reason for making the name change. Issuing press releases, and defending the indefensible, in Russia's case, is the responsibility of the Russian Embassy, not the Consulate. I have seen no references in the press since Russia invaded to confirm the allegation that the Consulate is spreading lies. The Minutes were silent as to the case presented for the renaming of Fullerton Street at the 9 May meeting. If there was a case for doing so, it would be good to know what it was. There was reference to the Ukrainian and Russian ratepayers in the Woollahra Council area. Most demonstrations at the Consulate were attended by very few people. There were demonstrations by Ukrainians, and one or two by Russians. The Council should be aware that it will need to handle the change to Ukraine Street carefully, given the comparatively higher number of people of Russian origin in Woollahra. This is of concern to residents if the name change was to result in an upsurge of activity in our street and raise concerns about our security. The Council has advised that all residents would be responsible for changing their address with family, friends, businesses, service providers, medical practitioners and others. This will be burdensome for owners and residents, especially those who have no access to the internet. There will be issues with those searching for Fullerton Street on Google, and chaos if GPS systems are involved. The Council does not appear to have considered the effect this will have. The Council will have seen press reports that indicate renaming Fullerton Street will have consequences for our residents, and those residents in other Napoleonic named streets in West Woollahra, who are looking to sell their properties now and into the future. This will be a consequence far more serious than having to change addresses to a myriad of organisations. The Council should also take into account the precedent effect. There are a number of Consulates in Woollahra. Thirty years has passed since the Turkish Consul-General was assassinated in Woollahra by Armenian terrorists. There are groups and nationalities in Sydney, including Armenians, who will see this Russian precedent as a vehicle for them to pursue their grievances. Some of these groups are highly organised and have pursued their cause peacefully through the NSW Parliament. Renaming Tara Street, on the corner of Ocean Street, might be the first step for one of them. Others outside Woollahra will also see changing the name to Ukraine Street as a precedent. Finally, I reiterate my strong objection to the residents of Fullerton Street being used as pawns so that the Council can indulge in meaningless virtue signalling, and international political activism. I

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recommend that you dedicate your time to fulfilling your mandate, and in this area, that means fixing up the potholes in the roads surrounding Fullerton Street, clearing some of the drains that make the roads rivers in Woollahra during a rain storm, clearing the footpaths of leaves that can cause people to slip and fall after rain, and sorting out traffic flow issues around the area, as well as actually pursuing the long standing arrangement that large scale renovations comply with time limits for work to cease at a reasonable time in the afternoon, and at the weekend, and that there is no Sunday work.

I write in protest at the Council's vote and decision to rename Fullerton Street, where my family have been resident for 30 years, to Ukraine Street. Let me state that like many in the community, I am incensed by the actions of Russia in their invasion of Ukraine. The horrors defy description. Nonetheless, this decision is disdainful of Fullerton St residents and was done without referring the decision to the local residents, until after the fact. And even though it's easy enough for people, including non-residents to register a change.org petition, and create a symbolic statement, I would think it is important to consider the consequences. The councillors that have brought this motion forward were elected by Woollahra rate-payers to represent local issues and needs, and not to act as foreign-policy advisors or international affairs experts. Putting this motion forward is easy, it may stoke egos, and provide some symbolism, but what does it really

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achieve? If the Council wants to achieve something truly beneficial – like donating money, which many of us have done independently - why doesn't it vote to ask the local rate-payers to contribute say 5% of their rates to a cause for Ukraine, and to fund a health-centre or school? Something truly meaningful. Indeed, I would expect the councillors may wish to contribute even more than that, in view of their ardour to contribute and help. However criminal the current invasion of Ukraine is, these are not the only horrific actions of governments in the past century. If your actions are to mean anything, then we should we re-name Trelawney Street in Woollahra, where the Serbian consulate is located, to Srebrenica Street to honour the Bosnian Muslims massacred there. We should also petition to rename Ocean Street Woollahra, where the Turkish consulate is located, to Armenia Street to show solidarity with the millions of Armenians who were victims of genocide. Or maybe just call it Journalist Street to protest the many incarcerated journalists in Turkish gaols. I was born in Czechoslovakia, I would implore you to re-name Military Road in Dover Heights where the Czech consulate is located. This could be renamed Jan Palach Street, to honour both the Czech student who self-immolated in 1968 at the time of the brutal Russian invasion, and a country that endured a subsequent 20 year occupation. And I would be hopeful that Woollahra Council would urgently appeal to Sydney City Council, to re-name streets with Chinese consulate and visa offices to Uyghur Streets to support the 12.8 million Uyghur population whose rights are being trampled. Or Tibet Street. And the Saudi consulate is in York Street, so perhaps the councillors can petition to change this to Yemeni or Kashoggi Street. There are many more illustrative examples to make the point. Such as, as an extrapolation, supporting my forthcoming change.org motion to divest ourselves from a usurping colonial past and remove Captain Piper's name from the suburb of Point Piper, and change it to Bungarung. The most cogent however, for me personally, and for our community, is that the Russian Consulate in Fullerton Street is next door to the Wolper Jewish Hospital. Patients there may be holocaust survivors themselves, but many more will be descendants of survivors or of people whose family members were persecuted by Nazis and Ukrainian Nazi collaborators in World War II. Many will have very grim memories of antisemitic Ukrainian Schutzmannschaft or collaborationist auxiliary police, and the Ukrainians who actively supported einsatzgruppen or Nazi mobile killing units and participated in mass murders. (I refer you to read Timothy Snyder's Bloodlands [2010] for detailed information). A re-name to Ukraine Street will not be viewed so benevolently by descendants and will stir up equally disturbing reminders. Where do you draw the line on historical memory? I understand and am greatly assuaged that attitudes have changed in Europe; that there are new generations now in power in Ukraine, as in Germany. Nonetheless the point I wish to make strongly to the elected local Councillors and that I hope they

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understand and reflect on, is that historical memory doesn't last just a single generation or singles out specific selected feel-good events only. There is a greater understanding and context required, which this hasty decision seems to ignore. And the notion that we should combat nationalist violence with gestures like what to me is a vacuous street-change, that itself supports nationalism? In 2022? No thanks! Instead, sure, the Council can make a symbolic gesture, for all to see, during the Russian invasion. For example, like planting a Ukrainian flag across the road from the Russian consulate. By all means. This does not have the permanence of a street-change that in the future will require a costly reversal; and that does not affect some rate-payers individually or makes a hasty historically mis-placed statement that may be derided with the benefit of hindsight. Your comment on changes in street names where Russian embassies overseas are located is noted. To note, this is the Russian consulate in Fullerton Street, the actual Russian embassy is in Canberra, in Canberra Avenue. For consistency, are your councillors supporting a change of Canberra Avenue to Ukraine Avenue as well? It may draw violent individuals to the street who otherwise would not come here. It could act as a red flag to a bull. I want it put on the record through this email that I am expressing this concern to the Council. I do not think you should take this lightly and in the event that something does happen, it will be on the record that it was the Council's decision to go ahead with this name change despite a

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resident expressing this very concern. This would be very important in attributing liability. Have you done a risk assessment about what such a polarising change in name could do, particularly at this time? If not, you should not be making any decisions about such a name change. It maybe the Coincil's wish to change the name to show solidarity with the people of Ukraine. In the process, you will end up dividing not just the street, but I believe a large part of the community by this incredulous suggestion. I too have delusions of grandeur from time to time, but fortunately I usually pull myself back in line and accept reality. You're not the United Nations, you are a local Council, who need to look after the residents, ensure they are kept safe. Up to this point in time you have done an exceptional job in doing this. This suggestion to change the name to Ukraine Street is an abrogation of responsibility by the Council to its residents in the pursuit of a geo-political issue which is not your domain.
